

We would like to remember two great pillars of JCGB, who attained Sadgathi, Sri Dinesh bhai Dalal, and Sri Harendra bhai Shah. Dinesh bhai is one of the founding members of the center, he brought this center together with his great negotiation skills. He was instrumental in raising money for Jain Center, and he did all the bolis for the center, his presence is always felt especially during Mahavir Janma Kalyanak celebrations. Harendra Bhai a dedicated member of the Jain Center of Greater Boston, served as Treasurer and Vice President. He was passionate about helping those in need by serving Jain food at the Boston homeless shelter and supporting the Walk for Hunger, walking 10-15 miles every year. Also, two prominent figures of the greater Jain community attained sadgati, Sri Chraukeerti Battarak from Jain Matha Shravanabelagola, on March 23rd morning and Pandit Shri Dr Hukamchand Bharill ji, he has visited our Jain center a few times early years of our Jain center, 1990-2005.

In the past few months, we have continued to conduct several programs and activities that promote the principles of Jainism, Ahimsa, Aparigraha and Anekantvad. Our regular weekend online Swadyay from Sanjay Bhai and Dharmaraj Bhai has provided a platform for learning and reflection. On April 1st we had Lagu Siddacharkra pooja and Ayambil tapascharya coordinated by Dr Pankaj bhai Shah along with the Jain Society of Metro Chicago.

FEATURE ARTICLE: JCGB 50 Years Back and Now

JCGB history can be easily understood as the life cycle of plants which all of our kids learnt in school. Each plant has 4 stages- seed/germination, seedling and mature plant. Similarly, JCGB history can be divided into 4 stages:

Seed- Early seventies time (1973-1975)

Germination- Mahaveer jayanti celebration (1976)

Seedling- Building search and activities between 1976 to 1981


Mature plant- Pratistha in 2002 and moved to a new building in 2010.

1973-1975

In the early seventies people came to this area either for education in prestigious institutes in this area or high tech jobs. Around 50 years back on 9 September 1973 our three founding members Dr. Vinay Jain, Dr. Sulekh Jain and Harshad shah ji used \$5 to announce on radio, which is equivalent to current social media or smart phones, to inform all jain families about gathering to celebrate Paryushan Parv in Malden, MA. This was the place and time when jain families decided to have a center but all bigger questions were very obvious How? Where? When?.

Mahaveer Jayanti Function in 1976

Maharaj Sushil Kumar ji was on his second visit to the Boston area to celebrate Mahavir Jayanti. This function was at MIT and he shared his vision in the Mahavir Jayanti program that now there is a need for a temple in this area to celebrate festivals and give exposure to a new generation about our religion. With this thought only that day \$1200 in donations and \$5500 in loans were collected. At that time this amount was enough to buy a new luxury car, I don't think this is possible in any center anywhere in the world to do even today. Seed of Jain center sowed in 1973 germinated with the blessing and energy of Maharaj JI.



1976-1981

It took almost 5 years to show the first sign of a seedling, Jain center building, from germinated seed (the idea of own Jain center). During this time evolution of life was inevitable, families started growing, bought homes and some of them even retired to home also. However, the focus was not changed and in that spirit of having a center donations continuously kept coming. In 1981, Dr. Vinay/Laxmi Jain and late Dinesh/Chitra dalal along with many others saw the building at 15 Cedar St, Norwood. This building was a church constructed in 1898. Since the property was at the right price and appropriate to accommodate the families at that time the decision was made to buy this for the future Jain center. Dr. Arvind and Bharti Shah brought the panch dhatu (5 metals mixed together) Parswanath Bhagwan murti. September 6, 1981 was the historic day when inauguration/sthapna function was done. This is how the first Jain temple of the United States of America was born, which is known as the Jain Centre of Greater Boston (JCGB). From 1981 to the beginning of the 21st century Jain families in this area were fortunate to celebrate all Jain festivals in their own Jain Centre Building.

2002-2010

With time the community grew and it was felt that the temple could be expanded by adding more Pratima ji/Namokar Mantra shila. To accomplish this task Pratima Implementation Committee (PIC) was constituted including Sudhir Shah/Preeti Jain/Haren Mehta/Haresh Shah and Anshuman Gosalia. Pt. Jaikumar ji assisted Preeti ji in the summer of 2001 to select white marble partima jis for the temple. Sanjay Shah and his brother were instrumental in bringing brass parikar for center Mulnayak pratima ji from Palitana. All pratima jis/namokar mantra shila and parkar were received in the temple on 15 May 2002 and parthistha ceremony was performed on 7-9 June 2002.

PIC efforts upgraded the vedi and brought new energy to JCGB. Footprints to JCGB were continuously increasing from 2002 till the end of the first decade of the 21st century. This is the time period when JCGB faced problems that originated from the growth of the society like lack of space in general and for. shala; parking issues. To solve these issues the only option was to move out of the 15 Cedar St building. JCGB all-rounder volunteer team got activated and attacked this problem from all fronts. At one point JCGB temple was almost moved to Hopkinton but I think Norwood has some energy to hold JCGB within city borders. The team of Sudhir bhai/Premal Vora /Kulbhusan Jain/Sanjay Shah found the current building for JCGB.
