## **Vidhi-Vidhan Committee**

The executive committee of JCGB has decided to define the 26<sup>th</sup> and 27th June as the Uthpan and Sthapan days for the pratimajis. Moving the pratimajis to the new temple will not be defined as the pratistha since it is desire of the community to place all pratimajis in the future in a typical Jain style "Girbh Grabh" (gabhara) in the new temple. The EC has appointed a special committee to identify and extend invitations to the sharvaks and/or sadhus who are experienced in the Uthapan and Sthapan vidhis. This five member "Vidhi-Vidhan Committee" consists of Kulbhusan Jain, Dharmraj Khot, Ashok Shah, Harendra Shah, and Pankaj Shah. This committee in consultation with the invited vidhikars will identify all necessary vidhi, vidhans, puja, and pujans that will be performed during these 2-3 days event. ## **Constitution Review Sub Committee**

Executive Committee has appointed a 5 member Constitution Review Sub Committee (CRSC). The members are Dilip Jain, Arti Mehta, Shrey Shah, Chandrakant Vora and Narendra Zaveri. The Subcommittee has been appointed to review some of the issues concerning membership renewal and Treasurer's term.

The CRSC charged to evaluate the current process of membership renewal and recommend changes if necessary. With regards to Treasurer's Term, JCGB is in midst of a major and successful fund raising for the new building. With creative ideas we have been successful in raising large sum of money and financial accountability is equally important to comply with IRS regulations. The committee is asked to assess the constitution and see if any adjustment can be made with regards to the treasurer's tem under special circumstance.

## **Status Report for Renovations at 556 Nichols Street**

The new home for our Jain Center at 556 Nichols Street, Norwood was purchased on October 29, 2009. In early October, the Executive Committee of JCGB appointed a Renovation Committee consisting of Dilip Gandhi, Pradip Gosalia, Dilip Jain, Preeti Jain, Pankaj Shah, Sanjay Shah, Sudhir Shah, Kashmira Vora and Premal Vora. EC has an authorization from the Sangh for \$200,000 to carry out the renovation. The RC was given a budget of \$150,000 to accomplish a number of tasks including decisions about Vedi Room and a construction of new Vedi, construction of a shower facility, construction of handicap access from the outside, upgrading of HVAC system as well as decorations and painting.

As the time progressed, RC determined that there were additional needs to be met including a complete upgrade of electric system, need for an additional classroom, an upgrade of kitchen floor, construction of new bathroom and sink next to kitchen, a new bathroom at the upper level, etc. We also decided to install a vestibule in front of the main entrance and change the façade at the entrance. Many other needs were identified and the task list grew to over 100 items.

As of mid-March, many items on the task list have been accomplished or will be accomplished by March 27 when we have our first major event at the new center, a dinner that will follow the Mahavir Jayanti program at 15 Cedar Street. Whereas the list is too long, the following are some of the major items:

- Requested and received many suggestions from the community as to what should the new facility look like.
  - We have considered and, as much as possible, incorporated most of these suggestions in the work already accomplished or planned to be accomplished
- Complete clean up (including steam cleaning) of kitchen appliances
- Replaced kitchen tiles (old ones were vinyl and many tiles were broken) with Quarry tiles
- Ordered and received new furniture for all classrooms
- Asked Kiritbhai Upadhyay to help as architect and to oversee the construction
- Hired Jay of Stoneybrook Builders for construction work

- The following construction is complete or near complete:
  - New handicap access ramp (with a roof so that everyone can use it in case of rain or snow)
  - New vestibule at the front entrance
  - A new handicap accessible bathroom with sinks outside next to kitchen on 1<sup>st</sup> level
  - A new shower facility on the 2<sup>nd</sup> level
  - Changed men's room on 3<sup>rd</sup> level so that there is an unisex handicap accessible bathroom
- Painted all classrooms, library, upper hallways, including protruding beams with the help of volunteers
- Completed design of the Vedi and created a mock-up so that the entire community can see it and give us their feedback
- Hired Charlie of Resendes Electric to upgrade the electric system for some part of our facility
  - Changed lighting fixtures to more efficient and bright lighting in all classrooms, and new outlets and switches
  - Changed light fixtures to more efficient and bright lighting in the library and foyer
  - Sensor operated lights in all bathrooms
  - Replaced old Exit signs with new ones with battery back-up
  - Changing electric panels in the kitchen and auditorium
- Major clean up completed with help of volunteers
- Modem with Wi-Fi connection has been ordered

There are still a few items open that are contemplated to be completed within next few months:

- HVAC – Decide on the new system and replace existing system (this required an additional budget of \$50,000 which was approved by EC. hence the total budget for renovation is now \$200,000)
- Vedi Room – Construct Vedi, install marble and get it ready for inauguration
- Foyer decorations
- Multimedia installation in library
- Change the incoming power supply to 277/480 system and change all panels in utility room
- Outside cleaning and get the play area ready

- Move non-religious items from 15 Cedar Street to 556 Nichols Street

Many volunteers have spent their entire weekends at the new center helping us to renovate the place. Words are not enough to thank them because they have done the work with dedication reserved for their own place. We will continue to request the support from the community, and have planned for two open dates for the entire community to help us, once in mid-March and once in May. More details will be sent out as appropriate.

## *Volunteer Opportunity*

To run such a large organization it requires work of many volunteer hours. Through various program at the Jain Center, you can imagine how many hours EC members are donating so the community members can enjoy the celebration.

## **Random Act of Love**

**Priyanka, daughter of Kiran and Manish Shah of Westborough is in a small village in Maharastra on Indycorp Mission.**

Part of our mission that day was to commit a random act of non-transactional kindness, a task that appeared simple enough at first glance. We decided to look out for individuals that looked particularly destitute and pathetic, people clearly in need of a random act of kindness in our opinion. Yet, this task proved to be the most challenging of the day. In the end, we walked over to the Swaminarayan Temple, a landmark sure to attract plenty of elderly people, perfect recipients for our random act.

At the intersection before the temple, we bought a small strand of yellow flowers from a flower seller. She was a small, wizened lady in a tattered sari with a small pile of flowers sitting on only a mat at the curb. As we

crossed the street, I inhaled deeply enjoying the scent of the flowers that I had just purchased. On the other side, we caught her eye as she beckoned for us to return which we promptly but confusedly did. The flower seller handed me a garland of jasmine flowers and told me, "I saw you smelling the flowers. Take these flowers as well, they are much more fragrant." At the time, I was taken aback. She refused any additional payment for the gift. While I had spent an hour scheming about how to commit a random act of kindness, a poor flower seller had acted in a split second. I spent the whole day beaming; the aroma of the jasmine flower tucked behind my ear a constant reminder of the love that a stranger had showed me that day.

Looking back, I realize that it never mattered that the benefactor of this random act of kindness was a flower seller and that the recipient, me, was a well-off American although I found it remarkable at the time. Such distinctions are materialistic and the beauty of a random act of kindness is in the emotions that it elicits. The flower seller had seen something she could do to brighten my day and acted upon it.

On the other hand, in my conspiring, I had forgotten the underlying drive behind what we see as random acts of kindness; love. In focusing our efforts on the action, we had forgotten the emotion behind the act. A random act of kindness cannot be about a single act that we commit as our daily good deed. It's about noticing something we can do for someone to brighten their day without asking for anything in return.

It doesn't matter if the random act of kindness (or a random act of love as I'd like to believe) consists of carrying four litres of kerosene down a country road for an old lady or buying the stressed out stranger in line behind you at the coffee shop a free cup of coffee. In fact it could be as little as a warm smile that cheers up another person who will then radiate it out to others creating more warmth in the world. All I ask is that in your actions, you are driven by love.

By this point you probably think I'm crazy; advocating random acts of love without asking for anything in return. I recommend you try it. Be observant of what's around you. Is there something you can do to uplift someone for even a moment? What are you waiting for? The smallest things can make the biggest changes in our lives. Commit a random act of love.
